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### Reasons to retrain engineers

- Outsourcing, downsizing, company gone
- Microwave engineers are still in demand, but defense engineers are mostly gone in New York area
- Software engineers, programmers, analysts are still in great demand, many jobs but no applicants
- Project Managers 7800+ jobs daily in banking, construction, finance, healthcare, retail, etc

## Solution to the needs

- 1993: C and C++ Programming were offered at Jersey Central Power Light
- 2002-2003: Java and Advanced Java Programming were offered at BAE System, Ramada Inn, Wellesley Inn
- 2004-2007: Project Management was offered at High Performance Technology Inc and New Jersey Bulk Mail Center
- 2005: Marketing Research was given at New Jersey Bulk Mail Center
- 2006-2007: C# .NET Programming was offered at Avtech Institute Technology
- Total number of engineers/professionals trained: 220.
- Successful skill transfers lead to good jobs.

### **Revenue and Cost**

- 1. Cost of room is free and instructor cost is flexible
- 2. Revenue with 220 paying about \$455 each
  - = \$100,000 USD
- 3. Cost of Instructor and IEEE certificates
  - = \$50,000 USD
- 4. **Net income \$50,000** to IEEE North Jersey Section.
- 5. This surplus helps the IEEE North Jersey Section to run other activities

#### **Conclusion and Future Trend**

- Win Win for IEEE and displaced engineers
- Office support/call center clerks: get a two-year, four-year or MBA degree
- IT workers: get new skills in areas that you do not know, UNIX, Oracle, Java, .NET
- Managers/VPs: skill transfer, be realistic and flexibility in location and pay
